


Philharmonic Orchestra and Flute Choir Dress Code


Concert dress should include clean, pressed, black dress clothing from head to toe, such as:

Black belt




Black dress shoes are required

Religious headwear are acceptable




Legs must be all black, including pantyhose, tights or socks

Black masks are permitted




Black tie, black bow tie, or no tie are all acceptable


Sleeves must be 3/4 length or longer




What NOT to wear:




Short sleeves




Bare toes, legs, or ankles




Clothing with words or graphics




Jeans, casual or athletic wear




Visible undergarments or midriffs



Hats



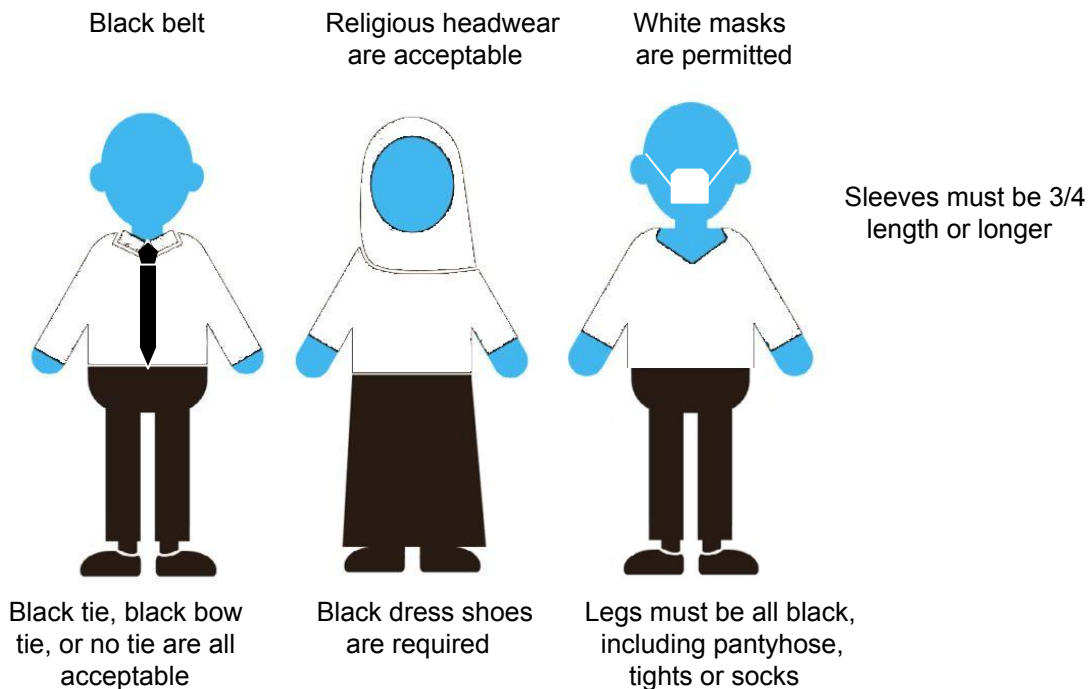
Large accessories or clothing with colored accents

Jeans, casual or athletic wear



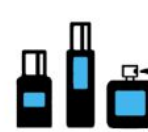
